UPDATE OF FINNISH AND SWEDISH ALERT GUIDANCE WILL COME TO FORCE 3RD MAY

We have changed some of the alert messages raised in the Finnish Medicines Verification System. The aim is to make the messages more understandable for pharmacies and wholesalers dealing with error and alert messages.

The changes have been taken into account in our Alert Handling Guideline, both in Finnish and Swedish. The English messages and guideline have not changed. The updated guidelines will come to force on 3rd May and can be found on our website.
